

We've dedicated a lot of time to preparation for AIMs Games and the Specialist Schools Kapa Haka Festival which Tauranga Special School hosted this year. We combined regular visits to Waipuna Park to explore the cross country course and engage in regular training, as well as making the most of sunny days at school to get out and be active. Pāpāmoa College - Brendon's class




