Education Review Office - Heads Up.

Kia ora koutou,

We have been informed that throughout August to November, the Education Review Office (ERO) will be reviewing 26 day special schools across the country. We have not been notified at this stage of our actual review dates.

The purpose of ERO's external evaluations is to give parents, whānau and the wider school community assurance about the quality of education children and young people receive. ERO reports on the equity and excellence of learning outcomes for all students and for specific groups including Māori students, Pacific students and students with additional learning needs. All our students fall into the last group. One key focus is on accelerating learning for students. ERO also reports on the quality and effectiveness of the school's processes and practices for continuing and sustaining improvement. Along with observational visits to several classes, the Reviewers interview staff, our Board of Trustees, a few families and if appropriate some of our students to gain a deeper understanding of how we tick. Following the review a draft report is prepared and the school has time to respond to any inaccuracies and then the final report is presented.

As soon as we are informed of our review date we will let our community know. The actual review process takes about three days.

Our last review which was very successful was held in September 2019.

Studio 5 has had a great return to school, getting back into our classroom routines. Continuing on from last term, we are focusing on completing our self care routines. These include: teeth brushing, face washing, hand washing, toileting and showering.

Each student is working on completing each step of a visual sequence with increasing independence. When we first started our focus on the self care routines, we noticed most of our students required some hand over hand support to complete the majority of the steps of their routines. However with consistency and repetition, we have been delighted to see our students now completing most of the steps with very little support.

This term in physiotherapy we are practicing walking sideways and backwards. This is to strengthen our postural muscles and keep our feet from turning in.

We are also training for our school cross country which will be held at The Domain early in Term 4. This is always a very special day for our school.

Students continue to make progress with their swimming. Most students are swimming weekly at our Base pool or a public pool. A reminder that our students and a caregiver can get free entry into Tauranga City Council Pools. Please contact us if you need a card to do this.
