A very warm welcome back to our whole Tauranga Special School community, and special greetings to our new students and their families.

Before our students' first school day we started our school year with two full days of professional development for all staff, with a major focus on introducing a new **TeamTeach** programme, our students' Mana Kaha Plans and extensive health and safety procedures. We will provide an outline of the TeamTeach programme in the near future.

Thank you to our families for the very high attendance turn out to our first ever **Learning Partnership** meetings held on Wednesday 31 January. The initial feedback we have received from parents and staff indicates that they were very valuable in terms of meeting and greeting each other, providing updates on each student's well being, and collecting essential information required at the start of each year.

At the end of last year our student roll was 113. We started this year with 111 students with a few more in the pipeline. In our next Newsletter we will have photos of our 20 plus newish or new staff members.

Brookfield Primary School Satellite (the new school's name is Te Kura o Manunui): Our students and staff in our Satellite are being accommodated in the front half of the old school, while their new accommodation is being built down the hill at the Te Kura o Manunui site. A special thank you to our staff, and some of their siblings, that helped set up the new classrooms. We will manage the site for the duration of our stay. We are currency sharing the site with *Kids Inc* - OSCAR before school and afterschool care providers.

Welcome Bay Primary Satellite: While progress has been slower than expected with the eventual planned move from the current classrooms to more suitable facilities on site, we are ramping up the refurbishment process. In terms of a timeframe for the eventual, realistically term one is out the first half of the second term. We will keep you posted on developments here.


Mana Kaha
