Room 2 students have been having fun exploring different types of transport and what makes the vehicles move and go.


















Occupational Therapy


The OT team has been working on toothbrushing across the school. There are a number of resources available to support our ākonga to learn to brush their teeth, these include:

A visual sequence



Tooth swabs

Oral swabs are great for first introducing tooth brushing especially for children with a hypersensitive mouth.



Three sided toothbrush

For students who have difficulty with fine motor and coordination.



Silicon toothbrush

For students that chew on their toothbrush or do not like a standard toothbrush texture.



Brushing teeth mouthguard

For students who have difficulty with fine motor and coordination.



Toothpaste you may like to try:

- Unflavoured non foaming toothpaste (Oranurse)
- Different flavours (Jack n Jill, Hi Smile)

Available Grants:

Type of grant	Limit exc GST	Number of Applications per Child up to age 22.
Equipment/Activity	\$5,000	Multiple times up to the limit.
Wellbeing and Counselling	\$1,000 x 2	Twice - can be used for child/parent/sibling.
Holiday	\$2,000	Multiple times up to the limit with no one holiday costing more than \$1,000.
Emergency	\$2,000	Applications capped at \$1,000, number of applications at the discretion of Trust Manager.
Hydrotherapy	\$800	Hydrotherapy/Water Confidence for 12 months. Please note that when the Hydrotherapy limit is reached, activity grants can be used for swimming.
Young Adults (17 - 21 year olds)	\$3,000	Multiple times up to the limit
