Board of Trustees News: Our Board is very pleased to announce that **Dale Megson**, our current Deputy Principal, has been appointed as our **new Tumuaki Principal** for our school commencing in the role at the start of next year. Barrie Wickens, our current Tumuaki Principal, tendered his resignation earlier this year that will draw to a close 23 years of amazing service to our school.

Te Kura o Manunui - new double satellite project, (Brookfield), has been delayed yet again: At the site, landscapers have removed all the scrub from the hill side next to where the classrooms were to go. Their actions have destabilised the slope. Geotech testing has been undertaken and three options to stabilise the slope have been presented to the Tauranga City Council. We are now in a protracted process waiting for the Council to decide on the best remediation option. The original proposed opening of the new facility was at the beginning of 2023. The new incoming National Government immediately froze hundreds of school property projects including ours. Several months later, the original architect and company to build the facility lost the contract and the process had to start from scratch. Modcom based at Taurico won the new design and construction contract. The actual modular designed building is sitting in Modcom's large factory, ready for transportation to the site, but it can't go anywhere till the land stability issue is resolved. In the meantime our students and staff destined to occupy the new facility, have been accommodated in the old Brookfield School that our Board are managing. What was supposed to be a one year stay is now nearing the end of three years. We are far from happy with this process, the ongoing delays, and continue to push for the project to be completed. As soon as we have a revised opening date we will let our community know.


