### Kia ora koutou,

**Staff Only Day Friday 1 November:** Thank you to our school community for your support while our school was closed for instruction Friday 1 November. The day was one of two days the government initiated to allow all schools to engage in professional development for staff to start to come to grips with the new reading, writing and maths curriculum changes, including one hour per day for each subject, starting next year. Realistically in our school and other specialist schools the government's expectation is unrealistic, as we already have a highly adapted and integrated approach to these areas of the curriculum. The Specialist Schools Principals' Executive are working very closely with Erica Stanford, Minister of Education, and senior advisors, as they recognise that their mandate will not work for our students and are prepared to consider a revised approach.

During the first half of the morning our teachers and specialists viewed several video presentations by Jane Farrell, Reading Consultant, on Emergent Literacy and Shared Reading, while our support staff revised via our Occupational Therapists Team, our behaviour Zones of Regulation programme.

All staff then travelled to Huria Marae, the marae our school is affiliated with, to learn about the marae's protocols for visitors, the history and significance of the buildings' architecture and more.

This term we have created some amazing Calendar Art. The students looked at lots of examples and thought about the things they like to create their artwork. Ka mau te wehi!



# TC3 Helen's class











# Mana Kaha Team

When it comes to supporting students with a variety of needs, our Tauranga Special School staff are very skilled.

Through our Team Teach journey, we've strengthened our knowledge and skills in de-escalation of situations and supporting our ākonga when experiencing extreme distress.

What we know, and what the Team Teach framework also reinforces, is that supporting ākonga well means to be *proactive*.

Our Mana Kaha team has been honing in on what being proactive means for us at TSS.

Proactively supporting tamariki at kura and home often means:



Understanding and responding to communication efforts (e.g. communication with physical gestures, using visuals, technology, speaking etc)

Using the Zones of Regulation check ins to develop the social and emotional learning of our ākonga, growing their understanding of their emotions and ways to regulate their bodies Checking in with your GP, paediatrician and other medical professionals in proactive ways, particularly when tamariki needs seem to change



Being aware of the unique sensory needs of each tamariki and exploring various ways to meet these needs (for example physical movement, deep pressure, headphones, music, calming tools) Planning
