Kia ora Parents, Caregivers and Whānau:

Open or closed - Day by Day Decision: With the speed with which Covid-Omicron is spreading across our communities, schools and kura are on a daily basis determining if they will have enough staff to ensure they can maintain safe adult to student ratios. We have a number of staff and students isolating at home.

At short notice families may be called and requested to pick their child or young adult up as their class may have to close. While we wait for the Ministry to determine the availability of RAT test kits for staff in schools and kuras, staff can only access Covid Testing stations when open. The cost of purchasing enough kits if available would be prohibitive for schools and kuras. We will do all we can to ensure where possible that we remain open but at this stage it is a real lottery.

Positive News:

In these challenging times it is good to have some positive news items. Our student roll numbers continue to rise. We now have 108 students enrolled, the highest total in our school's 56 years of being open. This number is set to increase gradually through the year.

Renovations to our two offsite facilities TC3 (Tauranga Community College Campus) at Chadwick Road in Greerton, and DRC (Devonport Road Campus) are underway. TC3 renovations will take approximately six weeks then the builders will move to DRC for the following eight weeks. At our Base School additional shade sails are in the process of being erected over our small

playground area, and we have beautified a feature wall in our swimming pool area with sea

creature murals.
