Board of Trustees Triennial Elections 2022:

Triennial elections for school boards have been moved from April this year to between 5 and 23 September 2022. For the first time the election process will include the provision for electronic voting. The Ministry of Education has acknowledged that due to the impact of the ongoing Covid-Omicron situation, deferring this year's elections will better suit schools.

Some of our current Board members have declared that they will not be putting their names forward for re-election, so we will be looking within our school community for new candidates. In due course the election process information will be circulated. If you are interested in standing for our Board you can find information through New Zealand School Trustees Association or the MInistry of Education websites.

Keeping our School Open: With the impact of the Covid - Omicron Pandemic that is impacting across our whole country, schools and kura are doing their best to stay open despite significant student and staff absences.
